5.0-Distance Learning Updates/ School Event Updates

There was a press conference from the superintendent: a plan to bring back prek - 3rd grade to start in a hybrid model. a plan will be presented to the board on January 16th, the governor will let us know where we are on Jan. 15th with the stay at home order.

Still in a holding mode

If approved, there's something written in the plan that the schools will have 4 wks to devise a plan to do it safely. This puts us into February before students could come back to school.

Budget: Budget dependent on taxes and revenues from the State which has been significantly impacted. Looking at a 12% cut next year

Martinez was able to roll over money, we've been prudent with what we've bought, however, the State is talking

about taking school's carryover money to help get everyone out of the hole.

By law, the Superintendent has to let everyone know how much money we will get (January 15th)

- Staff and supplies may get cut so we will have to have special meetings to discuss these concerns (may have 2 meetings in January and February)
- Zoom funding, we may not have funding for this next year (19 extra minutes of instruction that may go away, reading center will be affected)
- Our Read by 3 Strategist recently hired for Assistant Principal position so we were able to hire for a second grade teacher (Ms. Green)
- Mr. Blacklock has been meeting with a large group of second graders to support reading

After school budget: a 5 year plan that we've been funded for
